## Taylor Street Center

### Offender and Facility Facts

- The Taylor Street Center provides temporary single-sex housing, monitoring and transitional services for 127 minimum-security adult male and female offenders.
- The center helps offenders transition into their local communities after incarceration. The process involves teaching life skills so individuals become productive citizens.
- The center offers a self pay program, allowing individuals to meet court-mandated requirements while remaining in a community correctional setting and continue employment.
- Newly assigned offenders are subjected to a highly structured environment. As they achieve their treatment and rehabilitation goals, they earn privileges for decreasing structure.
- The center offers a residential program for pregnant offenders allowing the women to stay at the center for two months prior to their baby's delivery and three months afterward.
- The four-story building is earthquake safe and wheelchair accessible and includes rooms for recreation, dining and visiting.
- Some offenders may be released to home confinement with electronic monitoring. They must submit to random home and job-site visits and drug testing.

### Key Services

The following voluntary programs and services help prepare offenders to return to their local communities and provide for their well being while at the facility.

- Alcoholics Anonymous and Narcotics Anonymous provide substance abuse and addiction counseling services.
- HIV/AIDS and hepatitis prevention education and testing are provided.
- An on-staff psychologist provides mental health counseling. An on-site substance abuse counselor provides relapse prevention services.
- Life skills are taught in anger and stress management, budgeting, banking, personal hygiene, securing housing, victim awareness and conflict resolution.
- Cultural-diversity education, parenting/family skills program, women's group, suicide precaution class, weekly meditation group and prison fellowship/spirituality services are provided.
- Educational services include GED prep and Project Rebound, a program that encourages offenders to attend college.
- Employment assistance and training includes resume writing, job search strategies, and application assistance and interview techniques.
- Vocational training and assistance finding employment are offered.
